We hope you are all great! We are very pleased to share with you some **exciting news** in this newsletter edition.

It has been a busy month for us, during the last month we've had 3 Workshops and an EU Brokerage event. The first, was a virtual workshop organized by Pillars I – Atlantic Ports as gateways and hubs for the blue economy - and II – Blue Skills and Ocean Literacy - of the Atlantic Action Plan with the aim of discussing digital and blue careers. Following this workshop, we had another organized solely by Pillar II, in which digital learning and the impact of blue school was debated. Finally, we had another workshop organized by Pillars III - Marine Renewable energy - and IV - Coastal Resilience and healthy ocean - that was hosted at IHCantabria, in Santander, Spain, to overcome the subject of smart specialization for marine renewable energy. This workshop was followed by the EU Brokerage Session focused on interregional partnerships for Marine Renewable Energies.

We are also glad to announce that the 2nd Atlantic Strategy Steering Committee meeting of 2022 will be held quite soon, on the 1st of June. This meeting will take place in the Canary Islands, in Spain, and will include both Standing Members of the Committee and Associate Members. Amongst the topics discussed, will be a new and interesting concept that is being developed, that we are sure you will love. But more on this will be shared after the ASC Meeting.

Additionally, a National Event is being organized on the same date of the Committee meeting, in which the opportunities the Atlantic Action Plan can bring to the Canary Islands will be deliberated. This event is mainly oriented towards stakeholders in that region, but make sure to keep reading if you'd like to learn more about it.

Finally, we want to remind you that quite soon, the calls for the project awards and workshops for the 9th Atlantic Conference will be launched. So, if these might be of your interest make sure to keep an eye out for our next communication.

TOWARDS DIGITAL AND BLUE CAREERS

DIGITAL LEARNING AND BLUE SCHOOLS' IMPACT


