The Atlantic Strategy was launched by the European Commission in late 2011 to identify key challenges and opportunities to create jobs and foster economic development. Through Atlantic Forums, which were held in each of the five Atlantic Member States, the Atlantic Strategy identified research and investment priorities to revitalise and further grow the 'blue' economy.

The support team for the Atlantic Action Plan was created in late 2014 to provide guidance and proactive support for stakeholders and investors to find funding sources and project partners across the Atlantic to put forward and/or develop joint projects to implement the Action Plan.

This workshop is the first UK event that aims to bring together public and private sector organisations, research institutions, investors and other stakeholders with an





interest in sharing project ideas, finding potential project partners and identifying funding sources in order to develop projects to implement the objectives of the Action Plan (please see: www.atlanticstrategy.eu for further details on the Action Plan and its objectives).

What can you expect to get out of this workshop?

The objective of the workshop is to facilitate the exchange of information on funding streams and calls at various levels (e.g. local, national, EU) and to share experience and expertise on project ideas in line with the priorities of the Atlantic Action Plan.

The event is free to attend. During the morning session, participants will hear from the contact points of the various funding programmes, such as Horizon 2020, LIFE+, COSME and also the use of structural funds). After lunch, participants will have the opportunity to attend workshops on various themes such as marine leisure, fisheries and aquaculture, to share project ideas, meet potential partners and take the first steps of progressing project ideas into proposals for available funding. You will also learn about the role of the Support Team and how we can help you to form project consortiums and project proposals relevant to the Atlantic area. There will also be an opportunity for one-to-one meetings with the support team and programme contact points at the end of the workshop (these should be pre-booked, please contact the following email for further details: focalpointuk@atlanticstrategy.eu)
