Optimising and Enhancing Integrated
Atlantic Ocean Observing Systems



The AtlantOS project involves 62 partners from research institutes, universities, marine service providers, institutional organisations, international partners and the private sector from 18 countries.

It started in April 2015 and will last until July 2019. Its goal is to deliver an advanced framework for the development of an integrated Atlantic Ocean Observing System, contributing in achieving the aims of the Galway Statement on Atlantic Ocean Cooperation through the launching of a Transatlantic Ocean Research Alliance.

AtlantOS seeks to improve and innovate Atlantic observation by using the Framework of Ocean Observing to obtain an international, more sustainable, more efficient, more integrated, and fit-for-purpose system.
